

Child Safe Culture Policy

Purpose

This policy should be read in conjunction with the Child Safe Policy, Child Safe Procedure, the ECMS Child Safety, and Compliance: Reportable Matters Handbook, and the ECMS Child Safety Commitment Statement. It provides a clear set of guidelines and procedures to ensure:

- all children attending ECMS services are provided with a safe environment
- all reasonable steps are taken by the Approved Provider, educators, and staff to ensure the health, safety, and wellbeing of children attending the service.

Principals

ECMS, as an approved provider, has a legal and moral responsibility to ensure that all children are safe in their care, and will provide training, resources, information, and guidance to support this. ECMS is committed to:

- Ensuring that the health, safety and wellbeing of children at the service is protected at all times while also promoting their learning and development
- Fulfilling its duty of care obligations under the law by protecting children from any reasonable, foreseeable risk of injury or harm
- Ensuring that people educating and caring for children at the service act in the best interests of the child, and take all reasonable steps to ensure the child's safety and wellbeing at all times
- Ensuring its adherence to the ECMS Child Safety Commitment Statement
- Fulfilling its legal obligations to report all allegations and incidents of abuse, neglect, and misconduct to the appropriate authorities
- Supporting the rights of all children to feel safe, and be safe, at all times
- Developing and maintaining a culture in which children feel valued, respected and cared for
- Encouraging active participation from parents/guardians and families at the service, and ensuring that best practice is based on a partnership approach and shared responsibility for children's health, safety, wellbeing, and development
- Promoting children's development and wellbeing

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- Ensuring that additional considerations are made for children from an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander background, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) families, and children with disabilities and vulnerable families in order to keep children safe.

Scope

This policy applies to all ECMS staff including the Board, Executive, support services, students on placement, volunteers, parents/guardians, and others attending ECMS services, including during off-site excursions and activities.
